The pamphlet is divided into the following sections: Staff, Technical Training, Buildings, Provincial Surveys, Topographical Branch, Air Photography, Cadastral Branch, Minesfield Division, Revenue, and Town Planning Branch.  Some pages are loose.  There is also some maps included, listing the triangulations.

The introduction is reasonably detailed, and the collection of photographs is comprehensive. The quality of the photos varies. Some are black and white and some are colour. There are some annotations.
ICS/179/5	Written in 1990.	the 1950s and 1960s. Edited by Michael Anderson.  Where my Caravan has Rested - A Nigerian Diary by Eleanora Hunter.	The diary lasts from 13 <sup>th</sup> August 1946 to 22 <sup>nd</sup> August 1947. There are some photographs that are in black and white. It is very comprehensive.
