I. Introduction

1. Provenance

The Herbert Spencer papers were deposited in the University of London-Library in 1971, by the Athenaeum, Pall Mall, London. (1)

The papers had been left at the Athenaeum by Spencer's Trustees in 1936, when the Spencer Trust was wound up. (2) Presumably the Trustees had held the papers either since Spencer's death in 1903, or since 1908, after David Duncan had finished using them for his biography of Spencer published in that year.

David Duncan was a trustee.

Publication of any part of the Spencer papers should contain acknowledgements both to the Athenaeum and to the

University of London Library.

2. Description of papers

The material has been divided into four main sections: correspondence (the largest section); portraits, drawings, and photographs; 'reminiscences' of Herbert Spencer by various persons; newspaper cuttings.

A group (MS.791/3-10) of eight letters, 1843-9, is addressed to the Reverend Thomas Spencer (3) from literary and political figures of the period - George Crabbe (son of the poet), Cobden, Bright, W.S.Landor, and Sir Robert Feel (a short note only). They discuss political and ecclesiastical affairs.

There are two letters of 1847 from Thomas Spencer to W.G.Spencer (Herbert Spencer's father); one letter of 1864 from W.G.Spencer to his wife Harriet. Each of the three letters (NS.791/1-2, and /12) mentions Herbert Spencer.

There is a small group of items (below, pp.2-3), mostly letters, written by Spencer, which appears to have been preserved for the information they contain about Spencer's personality and habits. The abstracts of about 50 letters from Spencer to F.E.Lott

(MS.791/355/1) also contain a number of personal details, and mention Spencer's friends and acquaintances. Spencer's intellectual interests are indicated only briefly in these groups of letters.

The following letters to Spencer contain notes of various lengths, probably all in Spencer's hand:

MS.791/41, 49, 60, 61, 64, 68, 69, 77, 84, 93, 103, 114, 128, 147, 177, 212, 215, 216, 224, 275, 292, 334.

The rest of the correspondence contains letters to Spencer from many of his contemporaries. (1) A few letters are merely acknowledgements of the receipt of some book or pamphlet sent by Spencer. A number of the letters are personal, inquiring about Spencer's health, inviting him to dinner, or to tea and 'lobster sallad [sic]... before you go'. (2) The rest of the letters, while they may include acknowledgement of books or pamphlets, and some personal details, also contain discussion of Spencer's and the correspondents' ideas and work, with criticism and comment on contemporary science, philosophy, and sometimes politics. The letters from abroad often discuss the influence of Spencer's ideas, either in general on the thought of each writer's country, or on the writer's own mind.

Sixteen letters (3) of 1903 to 1904, written after Spencer's death, are addressed to Spencer's executors, or to his secretary, and include some comments on Spencer's life.

The portraits, drawings, and photographs include sketches and portraits by and of Herbert Spencer.

The 'reminiscences' of Spencer by some of his friends and assistants appear to have been consulted by Duncan for his biography, but not all of them were quoted by him. Most of this group of material appears to be unpublished. The group includes two items by Spencer - a short account of Thomas Carlyle, and a fragment of intellectual autobiography. (4)

3. Arrangement of the handlist

The numbers in the left-hand margin, prefixed by 'MS.791/', are the item numbers.

The list of contents on page ii gives the basic arrangement of the handlist. Within each section (except sections 9 and 10) the arrangement is chronological, with undated letters at the end of section 5. Addresses have been expanded or contracted without indication. If no town is given after the street name, the place of writing is London. Conjectural or doubtful information is given within square brackets.

Some references have been made to printed books containing extracts or quotations from letters, but such references are by no means exhaustive.

(It would appear, from various numbers on the letters, that they have previously been filed in a different order or orders - but no attempt has been made to restore any original sequence.)
