CONTEXT

Name of creator(s): Morgan, De family

Administrative history: Augustus de Morgan was born at Madura, India in 1806. In February 1823 he entered Trinity College, Cambridge, where he graduated in 1827. In 1828 he was appointed Professor of Mathematics at University College London. With a short break from 1831-1836, he retained this post until his retirement in 1861. He was married in 1837 to Sophia Elizabeth Frend. During his lifetime de Morgan wrote thousands of books and articles on mathematics, logic, philosophy and many other subjects, though his outstanding contributions were made in the field of logic. He died in 1877. His son, William Frend de Morgan, was born in London in 1839. He made his name initially in the arts and crafts movement, designing pottery tiles using medieval or art nouveau designs. Later he became a novelist with such success that he eventually abandoned his artistic career. Collections of de Morgan's designs are held in the Victoria and Albert Museum and the William Morris Gallery. He died in 1917.

Archival history:

This material was acquired at auction from Christies in November 1990. There is no information in the Christies' catalogue entry concerning the provenance of the collection, but there is evidence within the collection that this material was collected together by Joan Antrobus, as a result of her relationship with Molly De Morgan and Wilhelmina Stirling.

Scope and content: Papers of the De Morgan family, (1756-1928), comprising material relating to the suffragette movement, such as photographs, newspapers, press cuttings and pamphlets; correspondence of Augustus de Morgan, with correspondents including Sir Frederick Richard Pollock, Sir George Biddle Airy, Sir John William Lubbock, John Wrottesley (2nd Baron Wrottesley), John Radford Young, Sir John Frederick William Herschel, and General Sir John Briggs; correspondence of William De Morgan, mainly with members of his family and Sir Edward Coley Burne Jones; material relating to the de Morgan and Frennd families, notably family photographs, drawings, letters, legal documents and

memorabilia; letters from Sophia and Molly De Morgan to Joan Antrobus; manuscript and typescript copies of stories and essays by William and Mary de Morgan; papers relating to Sophia De Morgan's Memoir of her husband Augustus, including letters, reviews and working notes; bundle of letters containing correspondence concerning a petition to the women of America from the women of England about the abolition of slavery; printed material, mainly works by Augustus De Morgan; letters to Francis Baily, (1820-1940); letters from Thomas Henderson to Thomas Galloway, 1834-1842; 5 watercolours of Scotland by Frances Shakerley, (1920-1930).

System of arrangement: The current general arrangement of sections was largely imposed by the archivist, although the arrangement of the contents of various files can possibly be attributed to Sophia De Morgan or Joan Antrobus. The fonds or collection has been arranged into eleven sub-fonds shown below with their respective series:

MS913A Papers of Augustus De Morgan**1753-1870**

Morgan, Augustus De (1806–1871), mathematician and historian, fifth child of Colonel John De Morgan (1772–1816) of the Indian army, was born on 27 June 1806 at Madura in the far south of India. His mother, Elizabeth (1776–1856), was the daughter of John Dodson of the custom house, and granddaughter of James Dodson. Seven months after De Morgan's birth his family sailed for England with their five children, settling at Worcester. De Morgan was educated privately and sent to various schools, one of his teachers being J. Fenner, a Unitarian minister and an uncle of H. Crabb Robinson.

In February 1823 he entered Trinity College, Cambridge., and graduated as fourth wrangler in 1827. De Morgan was unanimously elected on 23 February 1828 the first professor of mathematics at the University of London. He gave his introductory lecture, 'On the study of mathematics', on 5 November 1828.

De Morgan resigned his post in a letter dated 24 July 1831, but returned in October 1836 when his successor, G. J. P. White, was accidentally drowned. He was reappointed and served as professor for the next thirty years. At that time King's College, London, was being formed as an institution under the Church of England, London University became University College, and the two colleges merged as the University of London, an examining body which conferred degrees.

In the autumn of 1831 De Morgan moved to 5 Upper Gower Street, where he was a neighbour of William Frend, mathematician and political reformer. He married Frend's daughter, Sophia Elizabeth (1809–1892) on 3 August 1837, and settled in 69 Gower Street.

His book *Elements of arithmetic* (1830) was his second publication and was to see many editions. In 1838 he defined and introduced the term 'mathematical induction' putting a process that had been used without clarity on a rigorous basis. The term first appears in De Morgan's article *Induction (Mathematics)* in the *Penny Cyclopaedia*. (Over the years he was to write 712 articles for the *Penny Cyclopaedia*.) The *Penny Cyclopaedia* was published by the Society for the Diffusion of Useful Knowledge, set up by the same reformers who founded London

University, and that Society also published a famous work by De Morgan *The Differential and Integral Calculus*. In 1849 he published *Trigonometry and double algebra* in which he gave a geometric interpretation of complex numbers. He recognised the purely symbolic nature of algebra and he was aware of the existence of algebras other than ordinary algebra. He introduced De Morgan's laws and his greatest contribution is as a reformer of mathematical logic.

De Morgan was elected in May 1828 a fellow of the Astronomical Society, he was placed on its council in 1830. He was secretary from 1831 to 1838 and from 1848 to 1854, and at other periods held office as vice-president. He also became a member of the Society for the Diffusion of Useful Knowledge (SDUK), founded by Lord Brougham and others in 1826. It published some of his early writings, and he contributed a great number of articles to its other publications: the *Penny Cyclopaedia*, for which he wrote about 850 of the articles, the *Quarterly Journal of Education*, and the unfortunately short-lived *Biographical Dictionary*. He also published with the society an *Elements of Algebra* (1835), and, especially, a massive and high-level *Treatise on the Differential and Integral Calculus*, which appeared in instalments between 1836 and 1842. He became a member of the committee in 1843. (The society was dissolved in 1846.)

De Morgan died on 18 March 1871 at his home, 6 Merton Road, Hampstead, and was buried in Kensal Green cemetery. At the end of his life his library consisted of about three thousand volumes. He was a genuine book-hunter, though his means compelled him to limit himself to occasional treasures from bookstalls. He made many amusing marginal and learned annotations, and turned his bibliographical researches to a good account in his historical writings. His library was bought after his death by Lord Overstone and presented to the University of London, where it became part of the University Library at its foundation.

MS913B Papers of Sophia De Morgan**c1760-1889**

Sophia De Morgan was born in 1809 in Blackfriars, London. She was the daughter of the mathematician and political reformer William Frend (1757–1841). She played a part in the foundation of Bedford College for Women, the first university institution in the United Kingdom open to women. She was also an advocate of the anti-slavery movement and women's suffrage, and was interested in spiritualism. She wrote a book on the subject called 'From Matter to Spirit: A Record of Ten Years' Experience in Spirit Manifestations (1863)'. This book was an account of communications from "beyond" based partly on ideas promoted by the scientist and philosopher Emanuel Swedenborg (1688-1772). In 1882 Sophia De Morgan published 'Memoir of Augustus De Morgan', a biography of her husband. She also wrote a book of reminiscences called 'Three Score Years and Ten' which was edited by her daughter the children's writer Mary Augusta de Morgan and published in 1895.

Sophia married Augustus De Morgan on 3 August 1837, and settled in 69 Gower Street. They had seven children, five of which were dead by the time of her own death in 1892.

Morgan, William Frend De (1839–1917), potter and novelist, was born on 16 November 1839 at 69 Gower Street, London, the second child of Augustus De Morgan (1806–1871) and Sophia Frend (1809–1892). De Morgan was educated at University College School, London, and at the college itself, and then entered the Royal Academy Schools in 1859. He left the schools in 1862.

During the 1860s he became acquainted with William Morris and Edward Burne-Jones. Towards the end of the decade he was working at 40 Fitzroy Square, where he had a kiln in his studio. In 1872 he burnt the roof of the house off, and had to leave. De Morgan's father had died in 1871, and c.1872 De Morgan went to live at 8 Great Cheyne Row, Chelsea, with his mother and his youngest sister, Mary Augusta De Morgan (1850–1907), children's writer. William built a pottery kiln in the garden of the house in Great Cheyne Row, but it was soon too small, and about 1873 he rented Orange House, almost next door, and started a pottery there. In 1881 Morris moved his works to Merton Abbey in south London; in 1882 De Morgan built his kilns near by.

On 5 March 1887 De Morgan married the painter (Mary) Evelyn Pickering (1855–1919). In 1889 he moved the pottery to purpose-built premises nearer home, off Townmead Road in Fulham. These were financed partly by Evelyn and partly by the architect Halsey Ricardo, with whom he formed a partnership in 1888. In 1892, when doctors advised that he should spend the winters outside Britain. From 1892 the De Morgans wintered in Florence. There was a temporary closure of the pottery in 1903; around 1904 he had to stop designing because of neuritis in his thumb; and the company was finally wound up in 1907, though several of De Morgan's employees continued under their own names.

Following the closure of the pottery De Morgan developed a new career as a novelist. In July 1906 his first work 'Joseph Vance: an ill-written autobiography' was published. 'Joseph Vance' was followed by 'Alice-for-short' (1907), 'Somehow good' (1908), 'It can never happen again' (1909), 'An affair of dishonour' (1909), 'Then came a likely story' (1911) and 'Ghost meets ghost' (1914). His two last novels, 'The old madhouse'

(1917) and 'The old man's youth' (1921), were completed by his wife Evelyn and published after his death.

De Morgan died at his home on 15 January 1917 and was buried in Brookwood cemetery, Surrey, five days later.

Aside from her biography of her sister and brother-in-law, Stirling produced many books covering a wide range of subjects, such as her children's story 'The adventures of Prince Almero' (1890), 'Annals of a Yorkshire house from the papers of a Macaroni and his kindred' (1911), 'Coke of Norfolk and his friends: the life of Thomas William Coke, first Earl of Leicester of Holkham' (1911) and 'Fyrie Castle: its lairds and their times' (1929).

The cataloguing of the De Morgan Library began in autumn 2004 and brought to light the existence of various letters from or to Augustus De Morgan or one of his associates such as Francis Baily which had been inserted into a notable proportion of the books. The first, historically, of the Library's Special Collections, the library of Augustus De Morgan (1806-1871), Professor of Mathematics at University College London, was purchased by Baron Overstone and given by him to the University in 1871. It contains c. 4500 books, pamphlets, manuscripts and autograph letters. The collection reflects De Morgan's interests as a bibliophile and mathematician including, for example; the first five printed Euclids, the first and other early editions of Newton's Principia, a number of early almanacs and works on mathematics, astronomy and actuarial science. There is also a major collection of De Morgan's own published works. Many of the books and pamphlets contain annotations by De Morgan
