Finding Aids for the University of London Archive

Records of the University of London were catalogued during the 1980s and this hardcopy catalogue produced in 1988. The bulk of the catalogue is in 6 volumes: 5 black volumes containing records catalogued under AC 1-AC 8; AC 9-AC 15; AP-CF; CN-SE; and SL-VP. There is also a separate volume for records of the Council for Extra-Mural Studies, (Ref: EM). This is complemented by a guide to the Council for Extra-Mural Studies and its archives. There is also a separate volume for College Hall (CH).

As well as these there are 5 small finding aids located on the same shelf. These are:

Records of the Hungarian Refugee Students Scheme: reference 'CB 3'

Examination Registers of the University of London, 1838-1889: reference 'D'. This has been marked for cataloguing as RO 2/1 so should be used in conjunction with the main catalogue (RO 2).

Handlist of University of London Registrars' Collection: reference 'RC'.

Architects Plans and Drawings of the Senate House: reference 'UL 10/3/1-7'. This should be used in conjunction with the main catalogue (UL 10).

Working Papers of the Council of the London Society for the Extension of University Teaching: reference 'LSEUT'

Since these were produced, newly catalogued records have been added in pencil to these guides. Recently, however, extensive work has begun on cataloguing University records onto a database searchable online at

http://archives.ulrls.lon.ac.uk

The online catalogue contains records not in these catalogues. Therefore these catalogues should be searched in conjunction with the online catalogue. Please feel free to ask reading room staff for assistance.

There is also a hardcopy catalogue for the University of London Collection. This consists of items written about, but not produced by the University.

Introduction

The records of the Extra-Mural Department of the University of London form both the largest and most complete holding in the University Archives at present. A large proportion of the documents that are present in the archive owe their survival to the efforts of R A S Knowles, Secretary to the Summer School of English from 1928 and Assistant Director of the Department from 1965. He held both posts until he retired in 1973. He was in the habit of retaining many documents which his colleagues were accustomed to throw away once their immediate use was over. Many of the documents he preserved, for instance the committee papers and the material relating to Vocational Certificates and Diplomas, are the only surviving copies in the Extra-Mural Department and form an essential record of its activities.

The origin of the Department lies in the late nineteenth century with the nationwide University Extension movement. It was intended by its founders to spread the benefits of university teaching more widely among the population. In London from 1876 to 1902 the activities of the movement were organised by the London Society for the Extension of University Teaching (LSEUT). Modelled upon the example of the Cambridge University Extension scheme it ran lecture courses and set examinations. The LSEUT was a voluntary body not officially connected with the University of London. It paid its running costs by charging fees for lecture courses, supplemented by grants from the City Livery Companies and the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities. It was governed by a Council of 22 members including a President, which was advised, particularly in the choice of lecturers, by a joint Universities Board composed of representatives nominated by the governing bodies of the Universities of London, Oxford and Cambridge. The lectures were organised on a local level by Centres run by committees. The majority of the papers of the LSEUT are listed below. However, a small collection of papers discovered in the periodicals bookstack of the University of London Library are listed in a separate handlist. The papers in this additional collection deal with matters of policy and central activities administered by the Secretary and the Council of the LSEUT: finance, the printing of University Extension publications, and the campaign for the Extension movement to be included in a teaching university for London.

In 1900 the University of London was reconstituted as a teaching university. Until that time the University was primarily an examining and degree awarding body and did not directly concern itself with the teaching of students. As part of its new role, the University of London took on the work of the LSEUT. The University set up the Board to Promote the Extension of University Teaching (BPEUT) in order to undertake that task.

The BPEUT continued the University Extension lectures and examinations but developed into new areas. In 1903 a Scheme of Study in the Humanities was created to 'present a broad view of History in its largest aspects (treated not merely from the political point of view, but also from the economic, industrial and gocial points of view) with Literature and Art...'. The course was to extend over 4-5 years. At the end of each session examinations were set and Sessional Certificates were awarded to successful candidates. The Vice-Chancellor's Certificate was awarded to candidates completing 4 years of successful study. In 1909 a Scheme of Study for Diplomas in the Humanities was created. By 1957 there were seven diplomas: Literature, History, Economics, History of Art, Biblical and Religious Studies, Sociology and International Affairs.

In 1904 the BPEUT held the first of its annual Holiday Courses for Foreign Teachers. The courses were designed to enable foreign teachers, and subsequently students, to get a first hand understanding of the English language. The title of the course has changed from time to time. The changes were as follows; from 1904-1911 the course was known as the 'Holiday Course for Foreign Teachers', 1911-1936 as the 'Holiday Course for Foreigners', 1936-1939 the 'Holiday Course in English for Overseas Students', 1947-1952 the 'Holiday Course in English for Foreign Students', 1952-1963 as the 'Summer Vacation Course in English for Foreign Students'. Finally, from 1963 it has been intitled simply the 'Summer School of English'.

In addition, in 1909 the BPEUT first organised a series of tutorial classes in conjunction with the Workers Educational Association, in part to supplement the study done in the Extension Courses. The Tutorial Classes were run by the Joint Committee for the Promotion of the Higher Education of Working People, instituted to co-ordinate the activities of these two bodies.

From its beginnings in 1901 the BPEUT was responsible for school inspections and examinations, a service which the University had undertaken before the re-constitution of 1900. For documents relating to school inspections and examinations before 1900 one should consult the University of London Registrars' Collection (1840-1908) and the Examination Registers 1838-1889, for which there are separate handlists available from the archivist. The

² BPEUT, <u>University Extension Local Lectures: Scheme of</u> Study in the Humanities, Michaelmas Term 1905. inspection of a school was carried out largely in order to satisfy the University that the school under inspection was a fit place to hold the examinations for school children that were set by the University. Also the Report of the Inspectors could be used by the school governors to demonstrate to parents of a prospective pupil that the school was of a satisfactory standard. The inspection by University-appointed officials included consideration of the general scheme of study in addition to an investigation into the methods of study and instruction given. Providing that a satisfactory report was given, the school was entitled to supervise the University-set Matriculation and Intermediate level examinations administered by the BPEUT. In session 1908/9 the Matriculation Board was created to deal with matters relating to Matriculation, including the examination. However, school inspection and all other school examinations set by the University remained under the direction of the BPEUT.

The reorganisation of the Department in 1928 led to the setting up of the University Extension and Tutorial Classes Council with separate committees to deal with Tutorial Classes and University Extension work. The inspection and examination of schools was handed over to a separate body, the Matriculation and School Examinations Council. It is likely that the majority of the records dealing with school inspection and examination were transferred to the new department <u>en bloc</u>, although a few items remain in the archive of the Extra-Mural Department.

The most recent re-organisation came in 1952 with the creation of the Council for Extra-Mural Studies with its structure of committees, advisory committees and sub-committees (see diagram p.9).

In terms of scope, the holdings of the Department of Extra-Mural Studies can be divided into three groups. First, there are documents dealing with finance and policy decisions. The bulk of this material comprises the minutes of committees and sub-committees of the Extra-Mural Department which provide details about broad changes in policy and the appointment of personnel. There survive few records which deal with school inspections and examinations. Only a single volume (for the session 1907/8), intitled 'Minutes of the Board to Promotethe Extension of University Teaching (Matriculation)', exists in the archive. However, a certain amount of information dealing with decisions relating to school inspections and examinations is to be found in the minutes of the BPEUT for the period 1901-28.

In addition, two volumes of Regulations (for the sessions 1926/27 and 1928/29) give details of regulations, syllabuses and fees for the Junior, Higher and General School Examinations. The only working papers of the department preserved in the archive are those dealing with Vocational Diplomas and Certificates which gave much more information than the brief entries in the minutes of committees. The Annual Reports are also a source for financial and policy statements.

The second group of records consists of material relating to the teaching of students. To begin, there survive extensive but not complete sets of regulations, syllabuses and examination papers both for Tutorial Classes and University Extension courses. In addition there exists statistical information about the students. Very general statistical information such as the number of lectures given, the number of student attendances etc., is to be found in the Annual Reports. More detailed facts about individual classes are to be found in the Lecturers' and Examiners' Reports which enumerate the average number of attendances, the average number of weekly papers handed in, and so forth. The Lecturers' and Examiners' Reports contian also information about individuals: the grades students obtained for particular weekly essays and marks obtained at examination. Essays submitted to obtain Sessional Certificates in Honours were subject to more searching consideration and the remarks of the assessors are recorded.

From its earliest years, the extension movement was particularly concerned to attract working class students. Indeed, some of its funds were obtained specifically in order to make this possible. Thus, the LSEUT and later the BPEUT received grants from the London Parochial Charities for the purpose of providing 'People's lectures' in the poorer districts of London at a subsidised entrance fee and submitted reports on how the money had been spent. Two volumes of Reports to the London Parochial Charities survive for the years 1892/93-1920/21 and 1921/22-1929/30 respectively. Reports of the lecturers, particularly until c.1950, often comment upon the age, sex and social origins of their students. The Adult Scholarships Sub-Committee which awarded bursaries to enable students to enter a college and become members of the University of London for a period of full-time study was also concerned to choose working class students. Hence the minutes of the Adult Scholarships Sub-Committee contain transcripts of the remarkably informative references provided by individual applicants and record the reasons given by the committee for granting or refusing a scholarship.

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The records contain also information about the lecturers and tutors. The Extra-Mural Department has been able to attract teachers who either were to become in the future, or were already distinguished academics, composers, writers or prominent in public affairs. To name a few: T S Eliot, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Sir Banister Flight Fletcher, Israel Gollancz, Hugh Gaitskell, Barbara Wootton, Lord Hill and Millicent Fawcett all were involved in extra-mural activities. Sir Richard Crossman and Enoch Powell are also recorded as having given lectures for the Department. Thus, in addition to being a source for the history of adult education, the archive of the Extra-Mural Department contains records that may provide biographers with material relating to a slightly unfamiliar aspect of their subjects For example, details of applications for appointment to lectureships (and the decisions made) in the nineteenth century can be found in the minutes of the joint University Board. Similarly, there is an indexed volume of Applications for Lectureships (1902-1938) which records the name, age, address, degrees, experience, published works and courses offered by the candidate as well as the result of the application. Also there exist volumes of lists of lecturers and tutors up to 1946 which record in alphabetical order by lecturer, the centre, years, and courses that were taught. In addition, the Lecturers' and Examiners' Reports are a fruitful source, containing not only the reports of the lecturers, but also from c.1900-c.1950 the correspondence between the lecturers and administrative officers in the Extra-Mural Department, particularly letters concerning disagreements between the lecturer and the outside examiner over the marks awarded to candidates.

The records in the archive have generally been produced for or used by the central administrative offices of the Extra-Mural Department rather than for the use of the local Centres. Thus information about the running of the Centres is comparatively sparse. Nonetheless, basic details of all courses offered to students can be found by consulting the prospectuses, annual reports, the <u>University Extension</u> <u>Journal</u> and the two volumes of the Lists of Centres. The latter cover the period from 1877/8-1952/3. The volume of pamphlets 'Instructions and Information for Lecturers, Tutors, Local Secretaries and Examiners' (1911-1951) gives an indication of how the central administration intended that the work of the Centres be carried out.

In contrast the two volumes of notes compiled by successive Visitors from the Extra-Mural Department from 1907-1938 are a candid commentary on the quality of the lecturing, students and conditions in which the lectures were delivered. Also there survives a single volume of the minutes of the Wimbledon Centre Committee 1891-1903 which record University Extension work from the view point of the local rather than the central officers. Finally, the news items found under the heading 'Local Centres' in the <u>University Extension Journal</u> are a useful supplement to the more formal reports of the lecturers and examiners.

A third group of records comprises the publications produced to advertise extra-mural classes or to inform and encourage students in their studies. In this category fall such items as publicity leaflets, prospectuses, the <u>University Extension Journal</u>, and the list of schemes for group study produced by the University Extension Guild.

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ACCESS TO THE RECORDS

The conditions of access to the archives of the Department of Extra-Mural Studies will be as follows:

- Records which have been published (information leaflets, syllabuses, examination papers, prospectuses, timetables, annual reports, etc) and blank forms will be made available without restriction.
- 2. Other records, apart from those included in 3., below, will be made available when they are thirty years old. These records will be 'opened' on the first day of August after the contents of any bundle, volume, etc., have become thirty years old. Where a bundle or volume contains material of various dates, it is the latest date that will be used to calculate the opening date. No researcher will be permitted to consult the contents of a bundle or volume any part of which is less than thirty years old, without the prior written authorisation of the Director of the Department of Extra-Mural Studies to whom applications to use such material will be referred.
- 3. Records containing details of marks obtained by students for essays or examinations and confidential appraisals of the ability of staff or students will be closed for eighty years, subject to the discretion of the Director of the Department of Extra-Mural Studies, as in 2. above.

The above conditions have been agreed with the Departmental Record Officer and will be applied to individual classes as follows:

Classes entirely composed of material more than eighty years old are omitted from the above list.

Copying and publication

Photocopies of the records may be supplied, at the discretion of the staff in the Palaeography Room, for the purposes of private study only. No material may be published without the prior written permission of the Director of the University of London Library who will grant such permission after consultation with the Department of Extra-Mural Studies. Applications for permission to publish should be made in the first instance to the staff of the Palaeography Room.

Arrangement and document references

The Department of Extra-Mural Studies has been subject to many organisational changes. Generally, the records of an extinct board or committee were incorporated into the records of the committee which inherited its functions. In this handlist, a record series (e.g. annual reports) is treated as a single unit, but a new page has been used whenever a change in administrative organisation occasioned the transfer of the series to a new body. A note at the bottom of each page indicates that the series is continued on the following page under a new title. In addition, organisational charts have been provided on pp.8-9 to indicate the administrative structure at any given period.

References used in requesting documents of the Department of Extra-Mural Studies usually contain three elements: a letter code (EM) to indicate the record group, a section number, and a series number. Thus, the reference for the minutes of the University Extension Committee is EM 2/1. In the case of section EM 7, which contains records relating to vocational diploma and certificate courses, there is a further sub-division to identify individual files. Thus, EM 7/16/2 refers to a file on the inspection of the Sister Tutors diploma course taught at University College Hull for the years 1946-1954. The record reference number is typed at the head of each page; thus it acts also as a finding aid to this handlist.



The two sets of volumes of syllabuses which survive probably were produced for two different University Extension officials who had bound into volumes only a selection of the syllabuses in a particular year, doubtless on the basis of their working needs. Thus the sets of volumes listed below are not exact duplicates, but rather, two separate selections which sometimes contain the same material. Consequently, it is necessary to consult record series EM 2/20 which contains syllabuses and examination papers, in addition to series EM 2/21 which contains syllabuses only.

However, with the expansion of the programme and a higher turn-over of staff, the cost of printing all the syllabuses became too high. Consequently, the more ephemeral series of lecture syllabuses were produced in the typescript (duplicated) that is, the folio series, while the syllabuses for the lecture series that were expected to be repeated over several years were produced in the octavo format. The situation is further complicated during the period 1939/40-1945/46 where the printed octavo series were interleaved and bound into the folio series.

Each adult education class organised at local centres by the Council for Extra-Mural Studies was subject to two reports on its progress, one by the lecturer conducting that class, and if it was an examination class, one by an outside examiner. The reports were preserved in the volumes listed below. The Council for Extra-Mural Studies used several systems of arranging the material into volumes. From the first session of the Council for Extra-Mural Studies, 1953/54 generally three volumes were produced each academic year, entitled Volumes I, II, and III. Their contents were as follows:

- Volume I (a) Annual Report
 - (b) Combined recommendations of the lecturers and examiners
 - (c) Examination Papers
 - (d) Examiners Reports

Volume II Lecturers Reports

Volume III Lecturers Reports

The Lecturers Reports were divided into two volumes owing to the bulk of the material to be found. They are organised in alphabetical order of the name of the Centre at which the course was held. Volume II begins at letter 'A' and Volume II continues the sequence where Volume I has left off.

Throughout the 1950s the system (described above) of organising the material was continued, but from session 1958/59 the titles on the spines of the volumes were changed as follows:

> <u>Volume I</u> Examiners Reports <u>Volume II</u> Lecturers Reports Volume III Lecturers Reports

In the early 1960s the system then in existence of arranging the Lecturers and Examiners Reports was erratically applied. This laxity had a number of results. First, the volumes for the session 1959/60 were mistitled. The lettering on the spines of Volumes II and III read 'Examiners Reports' when in fact they contain Lecturers Reports. Secondly, some of the Reports for session 1963/64 were bound into the volume for 1962/63. In 1964 the series was split, creating two series: Lecturers Reports (EM 2/24) and Examiners Reports (EM 2/25). University Extension and Tutorial Classes Council, Lecturers and Examiners Reports

These volumes sometimes contain copies of the Annual Report. Owing to their increased size, each session's reports become split into several volumes towards the end of this series.

University Extension Guild: List of Schemes for Group Study

The University Extension Guild was an organisation concerned with adult education. Financed by public subscription, the Guild had a twofold objective: as a general aim, to link together the various local University Extension centres in the London area and to promote the University Extension movement, and on a local level to organise supplementary lectures, visits to places of historical interest and social gatherings for its members.

The Guild had connections with the University of London dating back to the days of the LSEUT (see BPEUT, minutes vol.1906/7, minute 359). From time to time the University Extension Guild received modest financial aid from the University of London and was accustomed to enjoy the use of University buildings on certain special occasions, for example the University Extension Guild conversazione, (see BPEUT, minutes vol.1908/9, minute 95). The List of Schemes for Group Study included details of the courses of study, the teachers, and the dates and locations of the meetings held.

Little is known about the volume listed below. Minute 1 of the meeting of 9 October 1907 (that is the first meeting of session 1907/8) records the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting (9 July 1907) thus indicating that the committee was in existence for at least the session before 1907/8. However no earlier record appears to survive. In session 1908/9 the Matriculation Board was created to deal with matters relating to Matriculation, including examination; thus it is likely that the series listed below ceased to be created after 1907/8. Nonetheless, school inspection and all other school examinations set by the University remained under the direction of the BPEUT and thus dealt with in the Board's minutes (EM 1/4) until 1928, when the work was transferred to the Matriculation and School Examination Council.

Until the academic year 1967/68, the majority of the Tutorial Class Syllabuses were bound into single volumes. The sessions 1959/60 and 1960/61 were the exceptions with an additional second volume, considerably smaller than the first part. In these two cases the first part was not entitled 'Part I' on the spines, but instead the lettering is edentical with the majority which appear to have no second part. In contrast, from session 1967/68 onwards, the Tutorial Class Syllabuses were bound into volumes of equal size. These two factors suggest that the second parts for sessions 1959/60 and 1960/61 contain syllabuses which were omitted from the first part, possibly due to an oversight.

The syllabuses are arranged by name of lecturer; the syllabuses of classes taught by more than one lecturer are usually at the end of the alphabetical sequence.

Part 7 Vocational Diplomas and Certificates Advisory Committees

The documents listed below were part of the working papers of R A S Knowles, Secretary to the Summer School of English from 1928 and Assistant Director from 1965. He held both posts until he retired in 1973.

The files contain the papers of sub-committees set up to supervise the vocational courses and the administrative papers arising from those courses. In terms of scope, the documents can be divided broadly into two groups. First, those dealing with vocational courses in a general way. For the period 1920-1934 the Joint Sub-Committee on Diplomas (see EM 7/34/1-17) dealt with the expanding programme of vocational diplomas. Thereafter, when a new course was proposed, an <u>ad hoc</u> advisory committee was created to investigate the matter.

There exist also sets of general statistics and reports. Thus, there survives a file (EM 7/27/1) which deals with statistical information about students: registered students, examination candidates, and diplomas and certificates awarded. Likewise the file EM 7/27/2 contains the departmental contributions to the Frincipal's report, statistics supplied to the UCAE and returns to the UGC. The files contain also a series of annual reports on the progress of the vocational diplomas programme (EM 7/27/1).

During the Second World War the vocational diplomas section of the Extra-Mural Department was involved in producing courses for prisoners of war in Germany. There survives one file of reports (EM 7/2/1) on prisoner of war courses for the period 1942-45.

The second group consists of documents which deal with particular courses. Often these papers include the minutes of the advisory committee created to devise a new course, as well as minutes of the supervisory committee once the course had been instituted. In addition one finds agenda. reports submitted to the committee, and copies of course prospectuses, leaflets etc. issued under the auspices of that committee. Sometimes reports submitted to committees can be used to provide information about individuals or groups. For instance c.1954 copies of a list of holders of the diploma in Dramatic Art 1925-52 (see EM 7/26/1) were sent to the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and the Central School of Speech and Drama. These institutions returned the lists, having added, if known, the occupations of the former students at the time of the survey. Thus, this survey provides a useful source for those interested in assessing the success of the diploma in providing a career in acting or for those researching the careers of individuals, particularly those who did not become notably successful. Of course, several of the diploma holders did achieve success, for example Peggy Ashcroft, but much more information can be found about these people elsewhere.

There survives also more specialised files. For example files on the financial arrangements for a course. In addition, where courses were held at institutions approved by the University of London for the purpose, for instance Chelsea College in the case of physical education, there exist files of reports by officials of the Extra-Mural Department on those institutions.

Below are listed in chronological order the vocational courses instituted by the Extra-Mural Department. It should be noted that the covering dates indicate the period when the courses were offered to students. This period does not necessarily coincide with the time-span of the records that survive.

Arrangement of section 7

The records listed below were stored in the offices of the Extra-Mural Department in a set of file boxes. The labels on the file boxes provided the main finding aid to their contents. On some of the boxes there exists a press mark written in red ink, with the prefix 'K'. Thus. K1, K14, K101, and so forth. It has been suggested by Mr. R. Morris, Registration Officer of the Extra-Mural Department, that the 'K' stands for 'Knowles' and this was part of R A S Knowles's filing system. Unfortunately, it has not been possible to follow this system in the list below because, after Knowles retired in 1973, another system of arranging the file boxes had been used which has distorted the original system. The post-1973 system did not use 'K' press marks, but instead added file boxes on to the existing series without giving the new boxes a press mark. Thus, boxes 3 and 4 of the Advisory Committee on Nursing and Sister Tutors are labelled in red ink as K16 and K19 respectively, but boxes 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the same set have no 'K' numbers.

In addition there existed a problem of identifying the boxes themselves and of access to the material they contained. A large proportion of the boxes had no press mark. Moreover, many contained material of so miscellaneous a nature, that it would have been difficult for a potential user of this list to discover what material was available.

For these reasons it has been necessary to impose a new system of identification on these records. In the new system, the basic unit is the file rather than the box, thus allowing greater flexibility in listing. For example reference number EM 7/2/1 has been alloted to the file; Prisoner of War Courses, general reports 1942-45. The reference number for each entry is listed on the left hand margin. However, the original order of files grouped into boxes has been retained. The resulting arrangement of the files is sometimes idiosyncratic. The researcher is advised to consult the index at the end of this list in order to ensure that he finds all the records on a particular course. The original 'K' system press mark appear in square brackets on the right hand side of each entry, where it exists. A square bracket with a dash, thus: [-] indicates the files are contained in a box without a press mark.
